Students NEW to ECSD will be required to login to a school computer during registration day to receive computer access to PowerSchool and be able to view your schedule or the parent will be able to log in through the log in sent in early August.

Course Changes: we will have limited flexibility with our full enrollment. If you did not get into all of your requested courses you can come to the main office on Wednesday, August 28th, for a course change. Please note that this is the ONLY COURSE CHANGE DAY FOR GRADE 10 STUDENTS. A Course Change Form will be provided. Please fill out the form and wait to meet with an administrator to address the concern.

**Arc Cards** for ETS are only available to students who have not received one from Edmonton Catholic School Division previously. If you have received one but lost it, you must purchase and load a new Arc card from outside of ECSD. Bring your new, loaded card to the business office and we will link it to Powerschool so you can purchase bus passes on it.

**School picture orders:** School pictures will be taken on your registration day. Proof packages will be sent to the school as well as emailed to the student. Orders must be paid online directly to Edge Imaging Photography.

# MAC STUDENT SERVICES

To our incoming Grade 10 students, welcome to Archbishop MacDonald High School and to all MAC students, we hope you are having a restful and relaxing summer holiday and return in the fall refreshed and ready for another exciting school year. We would like to give you some information about MAC Student Services and invite students to reach out to us for personal and academic counselling, post-secondary, scholarship, learning and educational needs. To keep all grades informed, MAC students will be invited to join the Student Services Google Classroom where useful and relevant information will be posted.

#### **GRADE 10:**

The Student Services Department is located in the Student Resources Centre. The SRC is normally a lively collaborative space where students can meet to discuss assignments, work on academics, research projects, arrange for a peer tutor and meet with a counsellor. Students are welcome to make an appointment with a Counsellor or Learning Coach any time. During your Grade 10 year you will be required to make many educational choices which can impact your future. Student Services urges you to communicate with teachers, grade coordinators and counsellors as you move throughout the year and explore various courses and programs. The MAC community is committed to assisting incoming Grade 10 students with their transition to high school. You will learn more about our M-10 groups during Grade 10 Orientation in August.

Archbishop MacDonald High School encourages students to become advocates for their own education. Please don't be afraid to come forward and ask for help, clarification and advice on your own. Developing advocacy skills better prepares you for life after high school. The Student Serv'ices Department *is* excited to meet all the new Grade 10 students and we welcome you to Archbishop MacDonald High School and specifically to the Student Resource Centre.

#### **GRADE 11:**

Students entering Grade 11 should be aware of various post-secondary admission requirements when choosing their high school courses. Not only are specific courses required for certain faculties, final grade 11 marks are used for admission purposes at post-secondary institutions. Please feel free to speak to Student Services for clarification. We also strongly encourage Grade 11 students to attend the University of Alberta, MacEwan University, NAIT, etc. information sessions held at MAC throughout the year. Please stay tuned for updates as the school year progresses. Many other post-secondary institutions are also present during lunch or will be offered virtually after school hours. Make sure you take advantage of the opportunities that exist in the world of post-secondary education. Open Houses for Edmonton's large post-secondary institutions are normally held in the fall. You should plan on doing some research on post-secondary institutions in your Grade 11 year.

#### **GRADE 12:**

Our counsellor will be meeting with every Grade 12 student, during *Personal Learning Time*, in the first few months of the school year. She will discuss graduation requirements, post-secondary admission, and scholarship applications. Students will be required to complete a graduation checklist at this time. All Grade 12's must attend one graduation session. Student Services is here to support you and offer suggestions but ultimately students are responsible for ensuring all graduation requirements are met.

Please keep in mind that MOST universities, including the University of Alberta and MacEwan University, will be using completed Grade 11 and Grade 12 course marks for admission purposes and will not use marks for courses in progress. Applications for post-secondary institutions across Alberta open on October ist for the Fall 2024 cycle. Please ensure that all application requirements and deadlines are adhered to.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS:**

Every year Student Services receives many inquiries as to how to find and apply for scholarships. Scholarships are normally applied for in your Grade 12 year, prior to entering post-secondary education, and are the responsibility of the student. Scholarship applications are available to graduating students starting in the fall and continue right to the end of the school term. Students are encouraged to do their research early and stay on top of application deadlines.

You can also find some pointers and hints on how to apply for scholarships on the MAC website. Although academics play a large part in winning scholarships, students with extra-curricular involvement, community service and leadership capabilities are often more likely to win a scholarship over someone who does not have these experiences. The more involved you are, the better. You should also make sure you check with the post-secondary institution you are planning on attending. Often, they provide Entrance Scholarships for students who maintain a high average or are involved in leadership activities in their school and community.

The **Rutherford Scholarship** is awarded to graduating Grade 12 students from Alberta who have maintained a minimum 75% average. The student only applies ONCE at the end of Grade 12 for all three years of high school. This award is applied for online, and the application can be found at <a href="https://studentaid.alberta.ca/scholarships-and-awards/alexander-rutherford-scholarship/">https://studentaid.alberta.ca/scholarships-and-awards/alexander-rutherford-scholarship/</a>. The student should be accepted into a post-secondary institution and have their final grade 12 marks available before applying. Applications will be available for in-coming Grade 12 students in August 2024

#### .MyPASS:

All Alberta high school students are required to have a MyPass Account. Through MyPass you are able to view your high school transcript, view diploma exam results, request rescores, order transcripts and view personal student information. You can apply for a MyPass account at <a href="https://public.education.alberta.ca/PASI/myPass">https://public.education.alberta.ca/PASI/myPass</a>.

MyPass is essential for all Grade 11 and 12 students, but it is recommended that all Grade 10 students apply for an account as well. Please let someone in Student Services know if you have any questions about MyPass. Also, please remember that if you are rewriting a diploma exam, even if you are retaking the course, you must register and pay for the exam on MyPass before the deadline.
