Overview

Technical Theatre 15-25-35 offers students the chance to engage in non-acting roles that are required to realize complex theatrical performances. Students will be challenged to think and react creatively and critically while collaborating with teams to support the production and performance aspects of theatre. Students will have the opportunity to explore multiple technical roles, including stage management, sound, lighting, set & props, as well as costumes and makeup. Students will also develop an appreciation for the role and impact of the technical aspects of theatre as a means of communicating with an audience.

Guiding Questions:

- 1. How can technical theatre elements be understood, analyzed, and appreciated?
- 2. How can students demonstrate technical theatre skills through design and application in stage management, sound, lighting, sets, properties, costumes and/or make-up?



3. How can students demonstrate the individual responsibility necessary to participate as a collaborative member in a technical theatre team?

IB Philosophy

MAC's courses use the IB philosophy to encourage the holistic development of all students. Assessment

The assessment plan for the course will be a balance of assessment for learning, assessment as learning, and assessment of learning. Your summative grade will be calculated *cumulatively* throughout the semester with the following:

Course Evaluation – The process of creation and rehearsal and the performance element are valued equally in this class. Quality performances are a result of quality preparation, and quality preparation will result in a higher caliber of performance.

Course Work 100%

- Design and execution of design, loading and transportation of sets, props, costumes, etc, tech week
- Students performance in the show: support for the show in running cues, set changes, costume changes, etc
- Reflection on the process and performance

Disclaimer

A wide range of assessment information is used in the development of a student's final grade. Personal Mobile Device Standards

Mobile Devices and Social Media Use:

If a student is uncertain about the appropriateness of an idea, please discuss it with the teacher. Students should honour the direction and vision of the show.
- 4. Appropriate rehearsal behavior is essential in creating and maintaining a rehearsal atmosphere conducive to learning. Please respect your fellow students, and please respect the learning environment.

Unexcused absences and/or lates are unacceptable and may have a negative effect on the grade. Missed coursework may be expected to be completed and may be scored as zero or NHI until submitted (see disclaimer).
