


GRADE TE PROGRAMINATION OF THE PROGRAM OF THE PROGR

GRADE 10 ORIENTATION AND M10

At MAC, our Grade 10 students are welcomed the first day in the fall with a Grade 10 Orientation. MAC has students attending from Junior High schools across the city and starting at a new school can be challenging. This orientation day is a great opportunity to make new connections and develop new friendships. During this day students have the opportunity to learn more about MAC, find their classes, meet their teachers, and make any necessary changes to their schedule PRIOR to the Grade 11 and 12 students returning to class. Orientation day supports students in their transition to High School and gives them an opportunity to meet other members of the MAC community before actual classes begin.

M10s are randomly assigned groups of Grade 10 students who meet throughout the school year. The group meetings encourage friendship, communication, and support for fellow students. M10 groups meet for the first time during Grade 10 Orientation Day and periodically thereafter to ensure students are aware of teams and clubs they can join, how to approach exams, how to deal with a difficult situation, and how best to approach learning and studying while still having fun and connecting with others. M10 groups are led by members of our Peer Support Team and teachers who assist students in finding their way through their first year of High School.



All students who meet the entrance requirements at Archbishop MacDonald Catholic High School complete an Academically Enhanced Program. All of our courses focus on preparing the student for success in Alberta assessments, as well as post-secondary. Our Enhanced Program uses the IB philosophy to

encourage the holistic development of all students. The Learner Profile and Approaches to Teaching and Learning are used at all levels so that students develop a better understanding of curriculum objectives.


French B-IB (HL)

French B-IB (HL) is an embedded course in FLA 30-1 and FLA 30-2 for French Immersion students who wish to receive six university credits at the University of Alberta and other postsecondary institutions, only if they finish the course with a final grade of 6 or 7.

The French Immersion (FI) students who complete a minimum of 50 credits in FI courses will receive a FI certificate at the time of their graduation. In addition, ECSD will facilitate the writing of the B2 DELF exam. This official French Language Diploma will assist students who wish to have an international recognition of their language skills.







At Archbishop MacDonald, we envision an athletics program that serves as a unifying force within our school and community—where every student-athlete is loved and supported like **family**, represents our school with **pride**, and strives for **excellence** in sport, academics, and life. The Marauders Athletics Department recognizes and exemplifies traits developed through athletic participation that support our values. COMMUNICATION
TECHNOLOGY (3 credits)

through creation.

The Communication Technology (ComTech) strand covers the areas of graphic design, photography, and videography. At the Grade 10 level, students will complete a 1-credit module in each of these areas before specializing at the 20 level. The photography and video equipment are regularly updated, and students have access to DSLR cameras, high-quality microphones, and lighting equipment. Students considering a career in graphic design, photography, filmmaking, or advertisement would benefit from the experience gained by completing this course.

Communication Technology 30 (5 credits) can be used as one of your courses for admission into some post-secondary programs.

COMPUTING SCIENCE (3 credits)

The Computing Science strand of CTS is an introduction to algorithmic literacy, computer programming, as well as the history and evolution of computers and technology. The programming portion of this course has a project-based game design approach with students having the ability to individualize the projects they create to their areas of interest. This starts with the Scratch programming language and progresses into Java programming with Greenfoot, Eclipse, before finishing with some Python programming. This course is valuable preparation for students interested in pursuing a career in Computer Science, Engineering, or Game Design. Computing Science 30 (5 credit) is accepted by most post-secondary institutions as a 30-level Science.

DESIGN STUDIES (3 & 5 credits)

The Design Studies strand covers CAD (computer-aided design) work, with the intent of creating realistic 3D designs. Students start out using the modelling program Rhino3D, and some start to use Blender at the 2O and 3O levels. There are opportunities to complete projects that use the 3D printers at all levels. The ability to think spatially and in 3D model are very important in careers such as Engineering, Architecture, and Video Game Design. Design Studies 3O (5 credits) can be used as one of your courses for admission into some post-secondary programs.

EXPAND YOUR LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

BUSINESS & ENTREPRENEURSHIP (3 credits)

Students in Business and Entrepreneurship will create their own venture (business) with the opportunity to sell their created products/services. Most of the assignments are group work, and this concept stimulates the idea of a business model. There are a variety of assignments that accompany the venture that teach students basic business skills. For example, formulating a business plan, advertising, and a financial forecast.

CREATIVE WRITING 15 (3 credits)

Creative Writing caters to students for whom writing is a passion. Students will write in a variety of specific creative writing genres, and learn about the world of publishing and how to market their work. Mentor text analysis throughout the course will enable students to deepen their knowledge of the writer's craft. Through reflection, conferencing, peer editing and publishing, students will hone the necessary skills required to find success in a multitude of careers, from journalism to advertising. Students with a passion for the literary world will find encouragement and kindred spirits in this class.

FILM AND MEDIA ARTS 15/25 (3 credits)

Introduces students to film as an art form. Films are much more than entertainment; they motivate people, stimulate thought, encourage questioning, express personal viewpoints, and provide social and political commentaries. Films also convey the richness of the human experience at its best and worst. The intent of this class is to teach the student to appreciate

the artistic and narrative quality of film as one of our most endearing art forms. The primary focus will be on film criticism and analysis.

Numerous genres of film will be studied.

FITNESS PERFORMANCE BEGINNER (3 credits)

Fitness Performance is a CTS course that provides students with the opportunity to explore the world of athletic performance and training. At the Beginner level, students learn the basics of resistance, cardiovascular, and flexibility training. They also identify various ways to train in both individual and group settings. At the advanced level, students engage in a personalized fitness journey that will best help them achieve their fitness goals. Teachers help to guide students on this journey. Students who excel in the Fitness Performance course are likely to find success in careers such as Personal Training, Recreational Planning, and Physiotherapy. If you love being active and want to improve your physical fitness, this is the right class for you!

HEALTH FIELDS BEGINNER (3 credits)

Intro To Health Fields will appeal to students who want to learn more about the health, wellness, and medical fields. Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of health in Canadian society, medical terminology, human anatomy (especially pertaining to the musculoskeletal system), physiology, disease, the prevention and treatment of diseases and musculoskeletal injuries/conditions, therapeutic modalities, mental health and mental diseases, and much more. The content learned will provide students with a foundation necessary to pursue medical careers such as Physician, Nursing, Psychiatric Nurse, Dentistry, Respiratory Therapy, Optometry, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Chiropractic, Medical Imaging, Firefighter, Paramedic (EMR/EMT), Massage Therapy, or any other medical field.

SPEECH AND DEBATE 15 (3 credits)

Allows students to develop their skills in the various speech arts. Active participation and discussion by all students will foster increased confidence in public speaking and an appreciation of the validity of differing points of view and positions on a range of important issues.



INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGES

The second language program leads to tremendous opportunities in the global community. Students develop further cultural understanding through the process of learning multiple languages. All of our 20 and 30-level courses are offered in conjunction with the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. They promote cultural awareness, and they provide students with listening, speaking, reading, and writing applications.

All 30-level Second Language courses are accepted for post-secondary registration requirements.

SPANISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

SPANISH 3Y PROGRAM (5 credits per level) - No prerequisite

The Spanish 10 course is a beginning level designed for students with little or no prior Spanish language knowledge. As such, there are no prerequisite requirements. The Spanish ab initio IB Diploma course is offered within the 20 and 30-level courses.

FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

FRENCH 9Y PROGRAM (5 credits per level)

The French 9-year program is intended for students who have been taking French since Grade 4. The French B-IB (SL) Diploma course is offered within the 20 and 30-level courses. Prior IB knowledge is not required.

ENGLISH 10-1 ENHANCED (5 credits)

English 10 Enhanced is an academic course that integrates language and literary skills through the study of the short story, essay, novel, poetry, film study, Shakespearean, and modern dramas. Critical and interpretative analysis becomes an important function of both literary appreciation of texts and the creation of texts.

Students will be challenged to explore their understanding of author's rhetoric through a scholarly study of a variety of texts. English class will foster critical thought, independent learning, and imagination necessary to excel in post-secondary studies. Students at MAC have access to up-to-date resources & texts, dictionaries, laptops, computer labs, and printers dedicated for English classes. We believe practice makes perfect! Teachers work collaboratively and use common resources to ensure consistent standards and to prepare students for the next level of study.

Teachers are pedagogical leaders at the provincial and Division levels, are IB trained, and are dedicated to improving MAC life for students by being involved in a variety of extracurricular activities.





SOCIAL STUDIES

SOCIAL STUDIES/ÉTUDES SOCIALES 10-1 ENHANCED (5 credits)

This course explores multiple perspectives on the origins of globalization and the local, national, and international impacts of globalization on identity, lands, cultures, economies, human rights, and quality of life. The infusion of multiple perspectives will allow students to examine the social, economic, and political effects of globalization on peoples in Canada and the world, including the impact on First Nations, Métis, Inuit, and Francophone communities as specific human contexts.

As all students are part of the enhanced course, they will experience the curricular challenges through an in-depth development of the required related issues in an increasingly interdependent world. A greater degree of independent learning, written response, individual research, and classroom participation is required in the enhanced class.





MATHEMATICS

MATHÉMATIQUES/MATHEMATICS 10 COMBINED ENHANCED (5 credits)

This course represents the starting point for High School mathematics and is a prerequisite for entrance into the Mathematics 20-1, 30-1 and 30-2 course sequence. Mathematical comprehension and understanding are given a high degree of priority during this transition course into high school mathematics. Course topics include: Number Sense, Measurement (Metric & Imperial), Polynomials, Linear Functions, Systems of Linear Equations and Trigonometry.

SCIENCE 10 ENHANCED (5 credits)

Our Science 10 Enhanced is an academic course that expands the content of the Alberta Education Science 10 curriculum. It nurtures students' growth and encourages students to strive for higher levels of achievement. With an emphasis on practical work, the course provides many opportunities for students to apply knowledge and conceptual understanding in a broad range of contexts in order to achieve at a standard of excellence.


PERSONALIZED LEARNING TIME (PLT)

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Students wishing to apply to Archbishop MacDonald Catholic High School must have a minimum grade of 75% in each of the following Grade 9 subjects:

Religious Studies
English Language Arts
Mathematics
Science
Social Studies.

Students MUST ALSO have an average of 80% or higher in the 4 core subjects of English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies.

It is important to note that general academic courses such as English 20-2, Social Studies 20-2, Math 20-3 and Science 24 are not offered at Archbishop MacDonald Catholic High School. Students who are recommended for these courses are required to enrol in a high school offering the appropriate expertise in these areas.

As Archbishop MacDonald offers a robust academic program that prepares students for success after high school, it is required that all core subjects be taken at MAC.

ADMISSION STEPS:

- Complete the application form* available online at archbishopmacdonald.ecsd.net
 - * The application forms will be labelled as such:
 - Grade 10 French Immersion Application
 - Grade 10 Enhanced Program Application
 - Grade 10 Planning for Full IB Application
- 2. The following must also be submitted:
 - Part A Academic Standing documentation
 - i. Current grades dated within one week of application
 - ii. Most recent Report Card
 - iii. IPP (if applicable)
 - Part B Candidate Self Reflection
 - Part C Student/Parent Agreement
 - Part D Field Trip Form

- 3. Students must submit completed application documents and a copy of their birth certificate (if born in Canada) or proof of citizenship during application week which will run March 2–5, 2026.
- 4. Application deadline for the 2026-2027 school year is Thursday, March 5, 2026 at 7 PM.
- **5. Letters of acceptance or non-acceptant will be emailed** to each applicant by the end of April.
- 6. Verification of FINAL GRADES will be completed in June to ensure entrance requirements are met.
